THE MONTH OF MARCH IN HISTORY

- March 1, 1961: President John F. Kennedy established the Peace Corps.
- March 3, 1931: The Star Spangled Banner becomes the National Anthem signed into law by President Hoover.
- March 6, 1950: Silly putty is invented.
- March 10, 1862: The first issue of U.S. government paper money took place with \$5, \$10 and \$20 bills in circulation.
- March 22, 1972: The Equal Rights Amendment to the U.S. Constitution was passed by the U.S. Senate and sent to the states for ratification.

DID YOU KNOW???

Not everyone in the U.S. observes the time change. Hawaii and Arizona remain on standard time year-round along with several U.S. territories.

The proper expression for the time change is "**daylight saving time**" and not the commonly used plural version "daylight savings time" because the point is the saving of daylight. Some include a hyphen between the words "daylight" and "saving" when you consider the terms to be a compound modifier that modifies "time".
